

Birth Amendments Overview

- All submissions require a (VS 20) notarized sworn statement unless noted.
- If documents are not written in English, must include a certified English translation.
- Fees are dependent on when the request is submitted, please refer to <u>Vital Records Fees</u> to determine the fee amount.

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Add a child's first, middle and/or last name to blank fields	Form: VS 24B – Application to Amend a Birth Record	A photocopy of any supporting document reflecting the name you are attempting to add.
Correct spelling errors on child's name		A photocopy of child's social security card (number can be blacked out), government-issued identification card, or passport showing correct spelling of the name.
Correct a <i>hospital or local</i> <i>registrar error</i> in the following fields: o child's sex o date, time, or place of birth		 Form must state "To correct hospital error" or "To correct local registrar error" in the reason for correction <i>AND</i> at least one signature must be from one of the following: Physician/Attendant at birth Hospital Administrator (if <i>the physician or attendant is unavailable</i>) Local Registrar representative
Change sex field to reflect child's gender identity		 Without a court order, a child who is 12 years or older may self-attest to reflect their own gender identity: The reason field must state "To match the sex specified on my birth certificate to reflect my gender identity and not for any fraudulent purpose." The child must sign the application. No additional signatures are required. If the registrant is under 12 years old, a court order is required. At least one parent or guardian is required to sign the application. Sign the application. The child number of guardian is required to sign the application. 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Correct spelling errors on parent's name OR Correct parent's place or date of birth		A photocopy of the parent's birth certificate
Add parent's new name after a court ordered name change		 A certified copy of the parent's name change order is required. OR A photocopy of the parent's Naturalization Certificate for Name Change, from the Department of Homeland Security, is required.
Change parent designation to reflect gender identity on their child's birth certificate	Form: <u>VS 24B – Application to Amend a</u> <u>Birth Record</u>	 At least one of the following: A certified copy of the court-ordered change of gender, including a certified English translation, if applicable. The parent's new birth certificate reflecting a change of gender and sex identifier. A government-issued identity document reflecting the parent's change of gender and sex identifier. An affidavit attesting under penalty of perjury that the request for a change of the designation of the petitioner as mother, father, or parent is to conform to the person's gender identity and is not made for a fraudulent purpose. If child is over 18 years old, must include: A notarized letter from the adult child stipulating to the change to the adult child's birth certificate, "<i>I</i>, (adult child's full name), stipulate to an issuance of a new birth certificate for me that reflects my parent's legal gender and name."
